President's Letter, Winter 2024

What does BLA do all year long?

In Winter? (Dec-Jan-Feb): Disposal and Shoreline Access.

When the lake is down 20' from full pool shoreline access exposes logs and hazards and the crew can chain saw and remove them before the waters rise again. Disposal is BLA's #1 goal during winter to pile wood logs and debris that cannot be burned on the Winged Deer Hwy 11-E ramp to be loaded and hauled to land disposal at Iris Glen landfill. Thank you, Johnson City, for your brush trucks and dumpsters that make sure everything removed by BLA does not find its way back into the lake. Sullivan County, S. Holston channel does not have such equipment nor a land burial option yet (help us if you can, Mayor Venable); so BLA obtains burn permits and conducts controlled burns at secure locations of the logs gathered and corralled all Fall.

In Spring? (Mar-Apr-May): River Inflows and Annual Cleanup.

They say "April Showers bring May Flowers", but Mother Nature can rage and storm too. The annual cycle inundates the lake from logs and debris flowing into it from the Watauga and S. Holston rivers. During Spring TVA raises the lake level about a foot

a week dispersing all of the river inflows and causing any trees cut and dropped into the lake by some old and new shoreline projects (please have your tree services and personal cuttings removed before they float!). This is the most challenging time for BLA's crews and boats trying to clear the waters before the summer season begins. Thank goodness for April 20th and the 300 to 400 volunteers who turn out for the Annual Cleanup Event to remove and keep tons of debris and trash that would otherwise float into the lake this summer.

In Summer? (Jun-Jul-Aug): Tasks Response and Watching-the-Waters.

Prime-Time on the lake for all! 1382'! In addition to BLA's Hot Line (423-360-5057), we receive email (boonelakeassociation@gmail.com) and Facebook requests for crew help to remove dangerous floating hazards, dock-threatening logs, and other Contributor requests. BLA prioritizes all requests for help, even from non-contributors, with boating threats at the top of our lists. With the lake at full pool our crews are able to navigate all the way from Austin Springs to Bluff Citylooking for floating hazards every trip out. This year BLA is increasing our water sampling program in frequency and upgrading our instruments and test kits (see article inside).

In Fall? (Sep-Oct-Nov): Corralling and Gathering.



After Labor Day TVA begins the drawdown of the lake from full pool at the rate of about a foot per week. BLA then concentrates on logs and hazards that were just out of view, under the water during the season, as they are exposed. The crew then uses cranes on their boats to remove, load and transport them to be corralled at a couple of future winter-burn sites or staged at the Winged Deer or Pickens Bridge ramps to be removed to land fill by Johnson City.

In closing I thank you for your contributions and kind words of encouragement to our unpaid volunteers and our year-round paid-crew who all love our lake and wish to preserve it for our children and children's children. So, until we see you April 20th, BLA's 25th Annual Cleanup Event, our Silver Anniversary, or helping you in your cove or just having fun on the lake . . .

2024 BUDGET UPDATE:

Your Board has approved a 25% increased 2024 budget (\$178,000) over 2023 expenses with 95% earmarked for Lake Operations, Education, Awareness and Marketing. The largest increase is for water sampling and testing—a four-fold increase over 2023 that will be carried out in collaboration with Boone Watershed Partnership,

TVA and TDEC. A proposal for BLAassistance from the City of Bristol for the Beaver Creek area has been discussed and updates will be shared, if approved. Year-to-Date (YTD) spending is:

Water Quality Monitoring - Jim Slaight

BLA's Water Quality Monitoring results have consistently shown how lucky we are to have Boone Lake as a recreational resource. Overall water quality estimates at all our monitored sites are almost always "Good" with E.coli levels that are very low and well within EPA guidelines. This year our efforts are directed

at increasing the number and frequency of monitored sites and improving confidence in our estimates.

We are currently trialing the new water quality field kits, that are used worldwide for both drinking water quality and recreational water quality evaluations, alongside our former equipment. The field kits include E.coli tests

that will allow us to test more sites, more often than before and also allow us to



sample on the weekends. That means we can accommodate those volunteers that are only available on the weekends. So far, the results have been very good and we're looking forward to continued improvements.

LAKE OPERATIONS UPDATE - Jeanette Bailey

Ready or not, here it comes! Boone Lake is rising and the flowers and trees are blooming. Get your lakebed ready for the season. It is time to remove the leaves and debris. As the water rises, the shoreline debris begins floating. Call the BLA hotline 423-360-5057 for any logs or other heavy items.

The crew has been busy gathering and disposing of wood, tires, chairs and derelict docks over the winter months. The exposed shorelines are littered so it keeps us busy. Recently, SK #2 our barge with the large claw has been trolling from Boonies to Boone Lake Marina to retrieve reported floating logs and trees. These logs like to move around, but with your help we can try to find them all. Be safe out there!

BLA celebrated our 40th Anniversary, in 2023 with a dedicated focus on consistent water quality testing. In the past, volunteers managed the testing. Water quality testing by BLA Operations team began in early March to confirm that our new chemical and bacteriological equipment agreed. Additional details and results will be available in a future Shoreliner since we will launch our new program in April.

Johnson City continues to support BLA's effort at Pickens Bridge with a weekly pickup service. Our crew cuts and stacks wood on the ramp, "Free Firewood". BLA's board continues to collaborate with Sullivan County to find a solution for wood and debris disposal in the Bluff City area.

the lake temperature has warmed to the mid 50s at the surface. Stripers are concentrated in the center of each arm of the lake with the hybrid bass generally located downstream closer to Boone Dam. Crappie and bass fishing are also picking up all over the lake and can be especially good during the morning hours. The baitfish population has really increased since the lake has been back at full pool thanks to some of the tree growth that was left standing from the 7 years of downtime. The baitfish population is great to see and hopefully will continue to make Boone Lake a destination lake for fishing for many years to come.

- 16-22 inch Protected Length Range (PLR —no harvest) for all trout
- Daily creel limit of 7 trout, with only one over 22 inches

BLA Contributor Update - Gary Parker

2023 demonstrated an improvement in the number of regular/individual contributions to BLA. We are gradually climbing back from the low of 263 in 2017 to a total of 536 in 2023. However, we have yet to equal the elusive, all-time high of 601 experienced in 2014 prior to the dam repair. Although early in the new year, we are a little concerned that we are lagging 2023's contribution count (year-to-date) by about 40 contributors. Hopefully, this trend will reverse, if not it is a real disappointment. Our goal is to meet and exceed the 2014 total of 600 to support our objective of maintaining the lakes cleanliness/safety and monitor its water quality. The lake is enjoyed by a wide range of people consisting of lake-front owners and those that access it via marinas, boat ramps

and public beaches. Many in these groups contribute to BLA and all bolster the local economy. However, we believe we can do better. As an example, out of the 1798 lakefront owners in our database only 429 contributed (25%) to BLA



in 2023. This is one group that has the most at stake in the lake's condition and will hopefully improve its participation in 2024. BLA received many accolades about the cleanliness of the lake last summer, let's work together to maintain and improve that in 2024. Your contribution, however large or small, will help us meet that objective.
